NPDES STORMWATER PERMITTING PROGRAM FOR CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY

In 1972 the Clean Water Act was created after public concern for water quality began sweeping the nation. The Cuyahoga River of Ohio became so heavily polluted from industrial activity that it had caught fire at least thirteen times, the worst fire being in 1969 sparking the American environmental movement.

KEY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE FDEP CONSTRUCTION **GENERIC PERMIT**

- If you are impacting over 1 acre you will need coverage under the NPDES program
- Permit Coverage is good for 5 years.
- Required to have a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan prior to submitting for coverage.
- Required to perform site inspections 1x a week and after 0.5" Rain Event.
- Maintain Documents for 3 years after completion.

MAINTAIN COMPLIANCE

- **Best Management Practices**
 - Install and Maintain effective perimeter controls
 - Protect Inlets
 - Protect sensitive areas
- Implement Good housekeeping
 - Pick up trash and implement designated washout areas and waste management
 - Stabilize disturbed areas
 - Ensure building materials, stockpiles, and wastes are properly stored and covered.
- Education
 - Signage
 - Work with subcontractors to stay in compliance
- Proper Handling of Hazardous Materials
 - Report or clean up any spills seen on-site
 - Regular disposal of waste
 - Minimizing material exposure to precipitation
 - Use double-walled tanks and drip pans to collect and contain hazardous materials.
 - Have designated storage areas and holding tanks for liquid wastes
